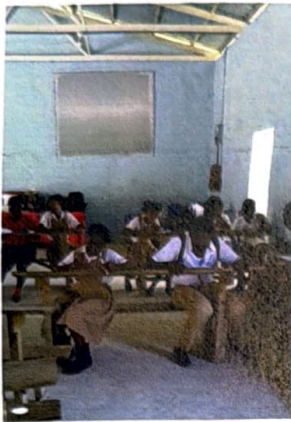
Will You Build the Wall With Us?

As we develop our new campus, one of our priorities is creating a safe and secure environment for the children, staff, and families we serve. A perimeter wall will help provide security, clearly define the property boundaries, and protect the ministry activities taking place on campus. The wall will be approximately 2,300 feet long and will cost about \$60 per foot to build, for a total project cost of approximately \$138,000.

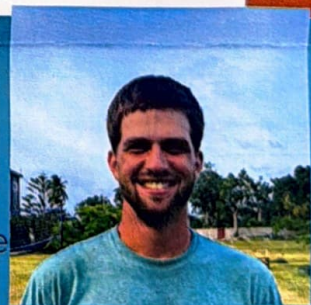
We praise God that the church is doing well. They continue to meet together preaching God's truth from His word, serving the community and the school and encouraging each other.

In May, I had a sweet 16 month old girl "J" who came to the clinic with a fever and respiratory distress, as a result of a nasty pneumonia. I immediately put her on oxygen and began administering medications, and warned her mom that she would likely need to be admitted to a local hospital. Her parents were very concerned for her health and fearful that a hospital admission would cripple them financially. We decided to allow her and her mom to stay in the clinic as she was stable on oxygen, and she continued to receive medication and oxygen throughout the week. She was able to go home five days later with check ins for the next few days. She healed completely and is back to her happy, playful self. Her parents are so grateful for the care she received and send their gratitude to everyone who prays for and donates to the clinic.

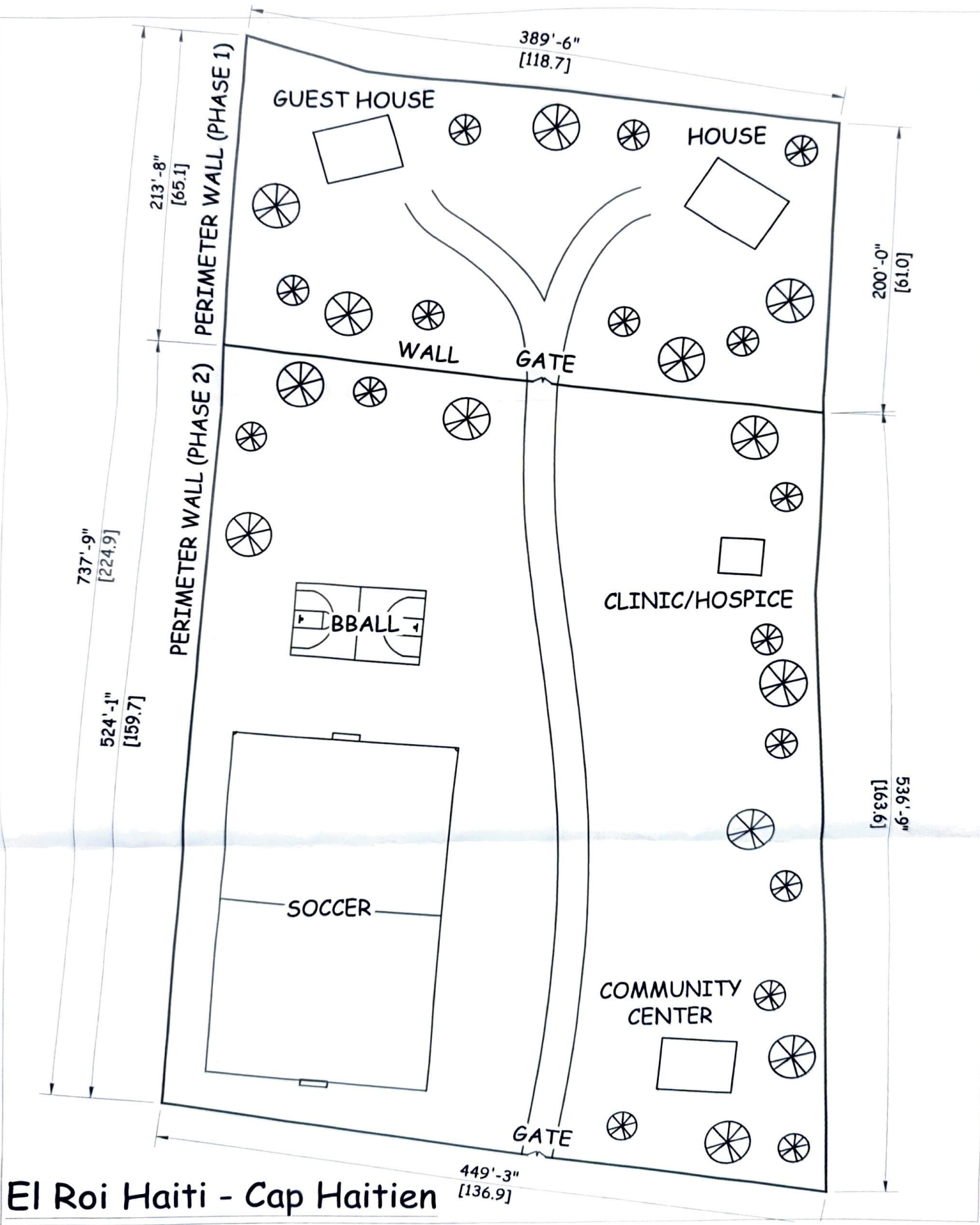

For the past five weeks, he has been meeting with around twenty teens and young adults once a week. They read a chapter of the book together and then discuss what they are learning and how they can grow in their relationships and heal from trauma they have experienced. He is very encouraged by the participants' thoughtful discussions and looks forward to how the Lord will use this time to transform hearts, minds, and relationships.
