

The students and teachers continue working hard to finish the school year. We are so thankful for the over 500 students that we were able to serve this year as well as for the 18 young adults who will be graduating - a huge accomplishment as fewer than 5% achieve this in Haiti.

We've launched a new initiative in the space formerly used as the clinic in Port au Prince — now repurposed into a mini professional trade school. This venue will allow students and community members to gain hands-on skills in:

- Computer literacy

- Cultural craft design (including covering shoes, bags, and accessories with African/Caribbean fabrics and creating original items)

- Moto-mechanics

We are thankful for two teachers who have been with us for over 5 years - Madame Lena and Madame Avril. Also celebrating our 6th grade teacher, Mr. Walnes who just completed his Masters degree in Educational Sciences.







The Bible Club ministry continues to grow, with more children joining each week. Currently Sandro has been teaching them stories from the Old Testament and how to see Jesus in them.

Two months ago, Shadrack joined the team and has been a great support. We are planning a modest salary of 4,000-6,000 gourdes (approx \$40) per month for him.

The English class Sandro is leading is ongoing and interest remains steady.

From Ohljens,

I was severely burned all over my body, and the day after I came home from the hospital, Nurse Alix came to see me and care for my wounds. That first day, I was really bad. I couldn't even turn in bed or lift my legs without help. I was very swollen, in unbearable pain, and I had maggots coming out of my legs. Nurse Alix came to my house every day to clean my wounds, debride dead tissue, and change my dressings. She also gave me medications for my pain and infection. She never asked me to pay a cent. There were some complications that delayed healing, and it has been about 4 months that Nurse Alix has been caring for my wounds daily. My wounds have now healed so much and my pain has improved significantly. The care I have received is so good and I can never stop thanking Nurse Alix, God, and the people who support this program for what they have done for me. Without this care, I don't think I would be alive right now. Thank you with my whole heart for your generosity.

Ohljens family has been bringing Sandro and Alix produce from their garden each week to say thank you. Please continue to pray for him - it seems that the more his body heals the less interested he is in hearing about Jesus and continues to practice traditional voodoo. Pray that Ohljens and his family would surrender their lives completely to Jesus!

Clinic has been busy lately! I see pediatric patients with all sorts of illnesses, as well as adult wound care patients. The most common cases I see are skin infections, upper respiratory infections, and intestinal worms. I love teaching parents ways to help keep their kids healthy and praying with them. Sandro has been doing a devotional and sharing the gospel with my patients and their guardians while they wait in the waiting room, which has been a huge blessing. Recently, I have taken. care of a few emergency cases. One included an infant in respiratory distress. I would like to say a huge thank you to the people who gave generously for us to purchase the oxygen concentrator. It made a world of difference in stabilizing this little boy.
