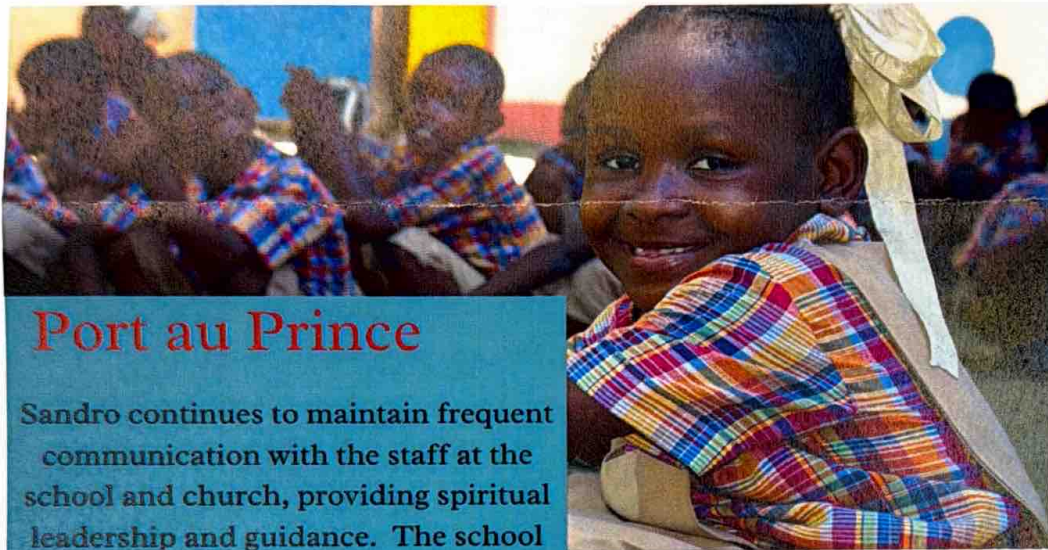

Sandro continues to maintain frequent communication with the staff at the school and church, providing spiritual leadership and guidance. The school year was going very well and we are always thankful for every day we can continue serving our students, however recently there was an increase in gang activity and we had to close the school for a short time. Eventually the gang said that school could reopen and that they would not disturb it, so school has resumed. Sadly, this is normal life for our Haitian friends. Please continue to pray that Jesus would be made known on our school campus and hearts would be surrendered to Him.

It has been chaotic and uncertain in Haiti for a long time now. Many of our students have never lived in a time when gangs weren't controlling most of the capital city of Port au Prince. Having a school where they are safe, get a meal, hear about Jesus and get an education is a stability and a hope that is priceless to them. Thank you for joining with us in providing this opportunity- it really matters.

Mr Revolus, a man at our church, has really been working hard at strengthening the youth group. He is consistent and motivates the young people in our community encouraging them to come and participate in chapel activities and discussions. Pray that more leaders would rise up from the church and serve and encourage others to follow Jesus.

Sandro continues to lead a weekly childrens Bible club, mentor kids in an after school program, host adult and teen Bible studies/english literacy programs and provide counseling. Sandro and Alix's days are full. God has given them both a gift of seeing people, seeing needs. They not only see but are also always finding ways to love people and meet those needs in the name of Jesus. Please continue to pray for wisdom and strength for all God has called them to do.



The last few months have been busy, especially in the clinic! We have been seeing many new faces as well as many returning families. Often, when a parent is coming back with their child for a new issue, they are sure to express their gratitude that the care and medications their child received last time brought healing, especially if they had already been to one or more doctors and were beginning to feel discouraged. I have had an influx in wound care patients and it has become one of my favorite things to see their wounds transform from gnarly, often heavily infected to beginning to heal to complete restoration. It reminds me of how Jesus' love can transform our hearts. Sandro continues to share the gospel in the mornings before clinic starts. It has also been a time where he can connect with the families waiting to be seen and encourage them, as well as to do trainings about healthy parenting. In the people in our community here in northern Haiti, we have encountered a lot more resistance to the gospel than we had in Port au Prince. Please continue to pray with us that these seeds being planted in their hearts will take root and flourish. Once again, thank you for all of the ways in which you support our ministry!
